

First Reading: Proverbs 8.1-4,22-31

Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: 'To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth— when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

Second Reading: Romans 5.1-5

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Gospel Reading: John 16.12-15

Jesus said to his disciples,

'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth

comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. Melissa Clark's reflection on the detail of the icon on the front on the pew sheet.

The icon on the front of our service book this week, is a reproduction of 'The Trinity' icon which was written by Andrei Rublev; a Russian icon writer of the 14 and 15th century.

The three figures are angels; the three angels who visit Abraham in the story in Genesis 18:1-8. This is a story that many biblical scholars have come to recognise as a scriptural depiction of the Holy Trinity.

The angel on the left symbolises God the heavenly parent, whose raised hand is blessing the cup on the table. There is a house visible behind this figure's head which represents the household of Abraham – the children of God.

The angel seated in the middle symbolises God the Son, whose hand is also in the blessing position but is slightly lower than the first angel. Behind this figure is a tree which represents the tree of Jesse or the tree of life. This figure wears blue and brown robes, symbolising the divinity (blue) and the earthly nature (brown) of Jesus.

The third angelic figure symbolises God the Holy Spirit and behind this figure is a mountain, which is a symbol of the spiritual ascent that humankind can accomplish with the assistance of the Spirit. This figure wears robes of blue (divinity) and green (new life).

Notice how the wings of each figure touch the one next to it, and the feet that are visible are pointing towards the other.

This icon invites us into the community of the Trinity when we look at it. There are three seats occupied at the table, and there is a space for us, right at the front if we choose to take it.
