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First Reading: Revelation 7: 9 – 17

9 After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. 10 They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' 11 And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, 12 singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' 13 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' 14 I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. 14 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden.

From Your Assistant Curate

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of All Saints. This is an important day in our church calendar as it relates to each of us as God's saints (Greek: hagios or 'holy ones') in the Church.

Christian theologians through the ages have long described the Church as the 'visible' and the 'invisible'. They are not two different churches nor are they separate from each other. They broadly describe the body of Christ known to us now as a visible assembly and those known to God in eternity. So one day the invisible will be made fully visible when Christ returns.

Another way theologians describe the catholic church is the church militant, and the church triumphant – the church triumphant is simply the church militant who has ceased from its warfare against evil, and has entered God's sanctuary in heaven to worship together with the cloud of witnesses (Hebrews 12:1-2). So we have far more support than we might realise – God's magnificent Church is not just made up of those we know now or those we see, but across space and time too; those who follow Christ throughout the world, and those across the history of time.

In this sense then, it is appropriate we celebrate All Saints Day in light of a challenging 2020. For many of us have battled on and many of us have been spiritually wounded. But today we remember those who have gone before us, trod our Lord's path, and finished the race with perseverance. They cheer us on as we persevere in difficulties and wrestle to restore Christ's supremacy in our lives. In reflecting on all the saints, those well known, those not well known, those whom we dearly miss, may we recollect precious memories of those who are at home with our Lord. By doing so, may their determined faithfulness be an encouragement as they urge us to fix our eyes on the Lord Jesus. Then when God one day makes the invisible church visible, we will be fully reunited with our Christian brothers and sisters through every age.
