# Mothering Sunday





From Ash Wednesday until the fourth Sunday in Lent there was observed a period of fasting - of giving up the pleasures of earthly life for the life of higher spiritual things. For health reasons it was broken on Refreshment Sunday. On this day the Lenten taboos on music, court entertainments and dairy foods were broken.

The day also became known as *Mothering Sunday*, symbolic of motherhood, family and the mother church. Children were encouraged to visit families and godchildren and their godparents. (As well as the spiritual sponsors, godparents were expected to be the legal guardians of their godchildren if their parents died).

So twice a year, Epiphany and Mothering Sunday, godchildren were encouraged to visit their godparents to show that both were still alive. They would often bring with them simnel cake, a rich cake made from fine flour (from the Latin *simila*, fine flour). This was often decorated with eleven pieces of marzipan, one for each faithful disciple.

By Elizabethan times a tax on flour was introduced to pay for the cost of defeating the Spanish Armada. This proved such a good revenue raiser that it remained. Enterprising pastry cooks introduced the early form of marzipan as a flour substitute, using dried fruit from the Americas. Thus the rise of the fruit cake for traditional celebrations began.
