Triduum

As we are getting to the end of the period of Lent, we are now looking towards Easter and to Jerusalem, the culmination of Christ's earthly mission.

To understand the spirituality of Easter, we journey through a three-day period known as Easter Triduum, (also called the Paschal Triduum), a period that stretches from the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, through to Easter Sunday evening and includes Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. During this time the Church "solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried and risen."

The celebration of the Easter Triduum helps us to understand the deeper meaning of the passion, death and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. It also helps us to understand our own journey of faith as Christians, and to ponder the events leading to our redemption.

What we celebrate in the Easter Triduum is the call to embrace the saving power of Christ and to live as people who have been saved and redeemed by that saving power. Every time we celebrate the Paschal Triduum – and any liturgical moment for that matter – we are being strengthened to live as Jesus lived, right here, right now.

When we celebrate the Triduum we look back to Christ's death and resurrection made present here and now in our lives and, having been strengthened and encouraged by our participation in Christ's paschal mystery in the here and now, we are propelled forward into the world to live as Jesus lived as the Body of Christ in the world. Our participation in the celebration of the Paschal Triduum – fully, consciously, actively – is a continuing rehearsal, not of the past, but rather of the way in which we are meant to live now.

The events of the Easter Triduum are not individual celebrations but more like acts in a play – we cannot get the full story, and fully understand and participate in it unless we take part in each and every act. By attending each service, starting with Maundy Thursday and concluding at Easter Sunday, we can become not just observers but full participants in this cosmic event of grace and salvation as we immerse ourselves in this very special time of the church year.

So let us take this Holy Week very slowly.

Day by day. Embracing each part and each event.

Savouring the moment.

I pray that you and your family (and maybe you can invite friends!) will be encouraged to join us for each of our Easter Eucharists.
